The School of Arts, Languages and Cultures at the University of Manchester invites applications for a full-time lectureship post in Egyptology, within the Department of Classics, Ancient History, Archaeology, and Egyptology (CAHAE).

You will have a PhD or equivalent in Egyptology and an excellent level of competence in all stages of the ancient Egyptian script and language (including Old, Middle and Late Egyptian as well as Hieratic), plus a knowledge of ancient Egyptian history and material culture.

You will be expected to contribute to the delivery of teaching on CAHAE's suite of Egyptology programmes, both by distance learning and by face-to-face lectures and seminars. Experience of distance-learning teaching is essential. You will also be expected to contribute to administrative tasks for the Egyptology group and, where possible, for the wider Department, including participation in regular recruitment activities and staff-student events.

BACKGROUND

Egyptology at the University of Manchester

Egyptology at the University of Manchester developed out of Continuing Education and, for historic reasons, was until September 2019 situated within the Medical School, where it offered a



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Certificate in Egyptology programme and a Diploma in Egyptology programme delivered by distance (online) learning, together with a number of online non-credit bearing short courses.

At the start of the academic year 2019-20 Egyptology joined the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures, becoming a key element in the new Department of Classics, Ancient History, Archaeology and Egyptology (CAHAE). This move coincided with the launch of a part-time MA in Egyptology delivered entirely online, the first such programme available anywhere in the world.

The transfer to CAHAE created the opportunity to design and deliver a face-to-face unit in Pharaonic Egypt open to campus-based students on other CAHAE programmes. Plans are now underway to offer a Minor in Egyptology for campus-based students. The Minor has been approved and will start in September 2021. Currently CAHAE teaches Egyptology to approximately 200 students, many of whom live outside the UK.

JOB DESCRIPTION

Key Responsibilities, Accountabilities or Duties

Applicants will be expected to contribute to the work of the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures and the Department of Classics, Ancient History, Archaeology and Egyptology.



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The successful candidate is expected:

- To design and deliver Egyptology teaching in a range of formats, which will include face-toface and online lectures, face-to-face seminars and online tutorials, on our current programmes and on the new Egyptology Minor, at both UG and PGT level. This will include the ability to teach Egyptian language units at all UG and PGT levels.
- To design and deliver Egyptology teaching (including Egyptian language teaching) to CPD students on our current online, non-accredited short courses.
- To supervise dissertations at all levels in Egyptology, including PhD students.
- To contribute to the planning and development of new programme units and/or CPD courses in at least one of the following areas: Ancient Egyptian hieratic, Coptic Language, Ancient Egyptian literature.
- To contribute to the management and administration of the subject area and to the pastoral care of its students in ways proposed by and agreed with the Head of Department.
- To contribute to undergraduate and postgraduate recruitment activities as required.
- To promote the discipline and the Department nationally and internationally.
- To work as an effective member of the Department and work in a collegial manner with academic and support staff.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

Essential Knowledge, Skills and Experience

Applicants will be expected to:

- Hold a PhD or equivalent in Egyptology, focusing on ancient Egyptian language.
- Have a record of research focusing on ancient Egyptian textual sources and material philology.
- Have a record of high-quality, research-led teaching at UG and PGT level, including online teaching.
- Have a strong commitment to the teaching of Egyptology to UG and PGT students.
- Be willing and able to contribute to other related areas of teaching and training as agreed with the Head of Department.
- Have strong organisational skills, excellent interpersonal skills, enthusiasm, and the ability to work collegially within a team.



Desirable Knowledge, Skills, Experience and Qualifications

Applicants may have or may be able to demonstrate:

- Experience of teaching Egyptian language at CPD level.
- Experience of designing and creating online teaching materials at CPD and/or UG and/or PGT level.
- Experience of supervising MA level dissertations.
- Familiarity with abnormal hieratic and/or Demotic and/or Coptic.
- Research and teaching expertise that complements current expertise within CAHAE at the University of Manchester.
